Kjetil Lund is the Director of the Norwegian Water Resources and Energy Directorate, a role he has held since 2019. He previously served as Oslo's City Commissioner for Business and Ownership (2017–2019) and was a State Secretary in the Ministry of Finance during Stoltenberg's Second Cabinet (2009–2013). Lund has also worked as an adviser to Jens Stoltenberg and as an executive at Statkraft.
